






3. Conquerors and Gardeners 1989, 4 Ctype Prints 61 x61 cms each (one work). Exhibition: A Place for Art. The Showroom London 1991

Description notes: A rosebud fallen from the bush before it had bloomed dried out and lying on the ground. An autopsy on the rosebud, cut and turned inside out gradually reveals the flower inside still alive. Double exposure of rosebud with projected transparencies from a digital clock. Title from Bill McKibben: The End of Nature.















4. Spelt From Sibyl's Leaves 1990: C Type Prints 100 x 100. Exhibition: PIVOT Oriel Mostyn, Wales 1991

Description notes: These photographs were taken at the location of the sibyl's cave at Cuma in southern Italy the mythological site of the deciphering of knowledge and meaning through divination. Combined with images taken from TV screens (page the oracle) and LED devices the distance between navigating through the world as a body and the reception of information through the screen is explored via double exposures and analogue film.

5. The Surface Beneath 1990: Collection Arts Council England. 92 x 336 cms photographs and LED lights.



Description notes: *The Surface Beneath* plays with relationships between the landscape and the body. The central image of the Solfarata at Pozzuoli in Italy is pierced with a grid of LED's alluding to the molten lava beneath the ground, the observatory symbolizing the mythological entrance to the underworld. The hands of the artist, either side, reveal the blood beneath the skin as they are placed in front of the light from a slide projector.
